


- COAG Trajectory for Existing Homes work program

What did you learn

- Consumer voice has been critical in influencing reform
- Reform requires long-term commitment and capacity:
 - Central coordination, tools and assets are critical to support broader engagement, but greater capacity will be needed to ensure implementa
 - Multi-year grant has enabled long-term strategy and coordination
- Benefits of coalitions and partnerships

- Development of credible and supportable policy
- Increased influence through breadth and depth of support
