

## **Board Communique: August 2017**

The Energy Consumers Australia (ECA) Board met in Sydney on 24 August 2017.

## Stakeholder forum

The Board meeting was preceded by a Stakeholder Forum on 23 August. The forum received presentations from:

- KPMG, about the Thwaites/Mulder/Faulkner review of Victorian retail markets
- Sun Powered Rentals, about their new model for solar ownership by renters
- The Total Environment Centre, about the local energy future
- The University of NSW, about the part renewables can play in improving energy affordability for low-income consumers.

Following the presentations, the ECA Board and staff heard from the broad range of NSW stakeholders in attendance about their key energy market concerns, including:

- the negative impacts of recent price rises on residential and small business consumers, including low income and vulnerable consumers
- issues relating to current market structures and their impact on costs
- the potential for consumers to benefit from innovation and the challenges that must be overcome for this to occur, including policy uncertainty and regulatory barriers

## **Board Meeting**

In additional to standard governance matters, the key focus of the Board meeting was the outputs of six recent ECA grants. The Board received presentations from:

- The National Irrigators Council, on research and analysis undertaken to support its submission to the Australian Competition Consumer Commission's inquiry into electricity prices and supply
- RMIT University, on their smart home control project, which explores potential for enabling technologies in vulnerable and disadvantaged households
- The Queensland Council of Social Services, on their work to advocate on behalf of low-income and vulnerable energy consumers in that state
- The Total Environment Centre, on their submission to the Independent Review into the Future Security of the National Electricity Market (the Finkel Review)
- St Vincent de Paul Victoria and Alviss Consulting, on recent tariff-tracking and price analysis in NSW, Queensland, South Australian, the ACT and Tasmania
- Bundaberg Regional Irrigators Group, on the feasibility of rural electricity users in regional Queensland (especially irrigators) going "off grid".
