

NATIONAL ANALYSIS OF SMALL BUSINESS RETAIL ENERGY BILLS

FINDINGS FROM ENERGY CONSUMERS AUSTRALIA'S JUNE 2022 TARIFF TRACKING REPORT



Nationally, average annual **electricity** bills for SMEs consuming 20,000 kWh per annum **increased by approximately \$15** between April 2021 and April 2022.

Average annual **gas** bills **increased by 4%** between April 2021 and April 2022 for SMEs consuming 100 GJ per annum.

ELECTRICITY BILLS



Businesses in **SA** have the highest annual bills (\$6,855) while **Tasmanian** businesses have the lowest (\$4,910)

Tasmania recorded the greatest annual decrease in bills (\$560) while businesses in the **ACT** have experienced significant increases (\$1,010)




RISING ELECTRICITY BILLS

Both NSW and QLD have experienced volatile wholesale markets recently. This has been reflected in a higher DMO/VDO which will take effect on 1 July 2022.

Our June Tariff Tracker **collects data in April** and therefore some of the **most recent changes may not be captured** in this report.

Our **December 2022 report** may shed more light on the impacts of recent changes such as increases to the DMO and VDO.



IMPACT OF REGULATED OFFERS

The initial **Default Market Offers** (DMOs) in NSW, SA and SEQ took effect on 1 July 2019. In Victoria, the **Victorian Default Offer** (VDO) also took effect on 1 July 2019.

The current DMO/VDO is lower in each jurisdiction than standing offers prior to 2019 by:

- NSW – 14%
- SEQ – 17%
- SA – 19%
- Victoria – 33%



NETWORK USE OF SYSTEM CHARGES

NUOS charges increased by 42% in the ACT compared with the same period last year. This is largely driven by the **ACT Government's legislation to supply 100% renewable energy**.

For this reason we are seeing **large increases in the overall bill in the ACT**.

GAS BILLS RISING

Tasmanian businesses continue to have the greatest annual gas bills (\$4,850) and **Victorian businesses have the lowest** (\$2,505)

Gas bills **increased in all jurisdictions** except South Australia. This **increase was significantly larger in Victoria** where the average bill increased by **\$360 (16.7%)** compared to a year ago.

There are a number of possible reasons for this including **rising wholesale costs** and a **tightening balance between supply and demand**.
