How are rising energy costs affecting our businesses?



In NSW, average electricity bills rose by 32% in the past year.

While the swim school and gym in the Endeavour network saw significant increases, they were less than the NSW average at 25% and 20% respectively.

The printing business in Perth saw the **same price increase** (2.5%) as the WA average.



How will the Government's Energy Bill Relief help?

The Federal Government's Energy Relief Fund, announced in May, means some small businesses will have access to between \$325 and \$650 off their electricity bill.

As Victoria uses a lower consumption level than other jurisdictions to define small businesses, the restaurant will not be eligible for the payment. For the other small businesses in our case study, it will reduce their bills by:

7% -12.3% -16.6%

-19.3%

Are our small businesses on the best offer for them?

The hairdresser in Victoria is on one of the **worst electricity offers** for businesses with their consumption level. Even their own retailer has lower advertised rates than they are on.

However, they **would only save about** \$130 or 5% by choosing the best offer. Their annual bill would increase by 41% if they chose the single worst offer.



The restaurant in Melbourne is on **one of the best offers** for businesses with their **gas** consumption level. Only three retailers currently have better offers.

However the restaurant **could save around \$1,490** by switching to the best offer. If they chose the worst available offer their annual bill would increase by 37%.
